View from the chair

Print show makes some points

There was a time, not long ago, when media bosses all over the world were so taken up with the new digital communication, that they planned for the death and funeral of print.

But, it turned out as the great American novelist Mark Twain wrote on 2 June 1897 in reaction to a rumour about his own situation: "The report of my death was an exaggeration".

A number of recent research projects has concluded that, although digital



communication is giving people more options, print is not only surviving, but in some cases actually growing.

For example, the print newspaper industry in India is flourishing, and so is the book industry in South America. Amazon has recently started to build physical bookshops. And it has been reported that today's young people are reading more print publications than those of previous generations.

In Hermanus we have two printed newspapers and various other publications, although many people also read a lot on the internet. We have more than a handful of active book clubs, where the reading material is mostly in printed form, although people find reading on a Kindle useful.

And our Club has had another successful print exhibition during FynArts in June, although we use digital cameras almost exclusively, and our montly evaluation is almost exclusively of images in digital format.

Club members on duty at the exhibition reported a lively interaction with people looking at the images, and it was obvious that the quality of our prints made a good impression. That much was clear from the fact that more than 90% of the prints received at least one vote each from visitors choosing their most favourite.

For the high quality we have to thank not only our participating photographers, but also our local printer Lawrence Brennon, whose work was impeccable.

Although the digital camera and the cellphone have revolutionized photography, our exhibition has proved that "old-fashioned" print is still the ideal medium for an interactive exhibition over a number of days.

This skill comes drop by drop

Five enthusiastic Club members attended a workshop on photographing "Falling water drops" by Elizma Fourie, in Hermanus on Thursday 22 June.

She explained the technical details as well as camera settings. She showed us all the various types of equipment that you could use, how to set up for the shoot and how to make sure that you are focusing on the correct area.

We eagerly set up our equipment, ready to photograph THAT water drop. Well, I think we all learnt the following:

Co-ordinating the timing of the drop and capturing the moment it splashes is WAY easier than it looks.

You have to concentrate!

You need infinite patience.

Remember to empty your container before it overflows (after the 1 000th drop).

Practice, practice and more practice!
